Under the artistic direction of Giuseppe Schembri Bonaci, this edition explores the significance of the Mediterranean as a geographical and cultural region, delving into the multi-forms of mythological, religious, and spiritual deities. The theme, 'Mediterranean Goddesses,' promises a captivating artistic journey.

Discover the Historic Roots:

- **Mdina Cathedral Museum:** Housed in a magnificent Baroque building with origins dating back to the early 1700s, the museum officially opened its doors in 1969. It preserves and showcases a remarkable collection of artworks and historical treasures.
- **Metropolitan Cathedral of Saint Paul:** Also known as St. Paul's Cathedral or the Mdina Cathedral, this Catholic cathedral is dedicated to St. Paul the Apostle. Founded in the 12th century, it underwent Baroque reconstruction by Maltese architect Lorenzo Gafà between 1696 and 1705, now regarded as his masterpiece.

Exclusive Access: During the Open Day, visitors can explore the crypts beneath the Cathedral. Discover the latest museum halls, including the Vestments Hall, Paintings Galleries, and the Sala Nobile. Don't miss the opportunity to delve into the museum's underground basement, unveiling Roman ruins that tell tales of Malta's past.

Museum Outreach Project: This Open Day is part of the larger "Museum Outreach" project, a collaborative effort co-founded by the VOPs scheme managed by the Malta Council for the Voluntary Sector.
